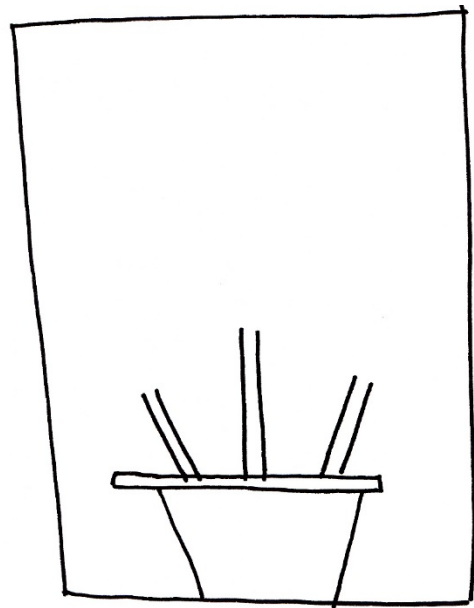
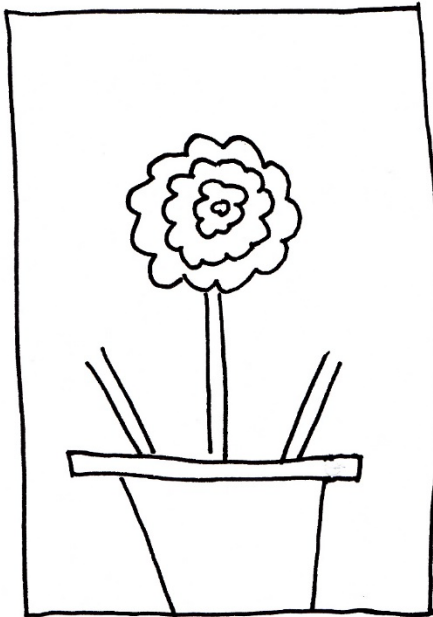


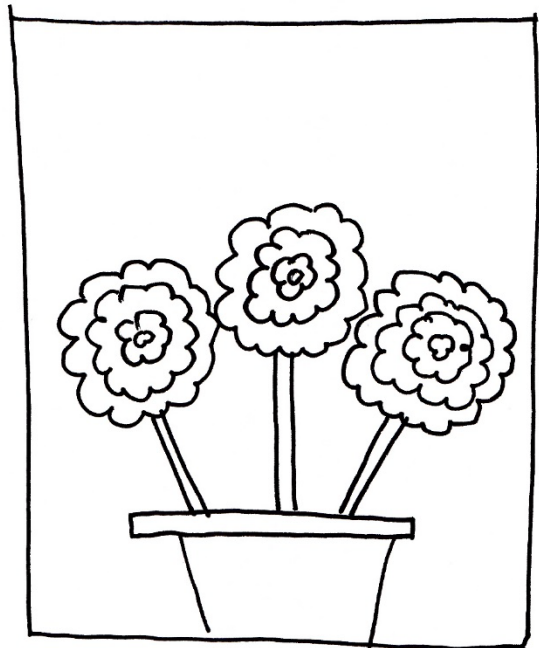
Draw the pot as shown. I always do this one line at a time so as not to overwhelm the students.



Next, draw the stems. One at a time.



Draw one flower by drawing a round "cloud." Then, draw 2-3 more round "clouds" inside the first one.



Finally, draw the rest of the flowers. Have students trace over their drawing with black Sharpie or crayon and then paint with watercolors,



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
